UIC is the first independent liberal arts college in Korea to conduct all its classes in English. It was established in February 2005 to meet the growing demand for global education among Korean high school graduates and for foreign students seeking an East-Asia-based liberal arts education.

### Why UIC? – Three in One

#### Freshman Year

The freshman year curriculum is designed for today's increasingly global world. UIC's strong curriculum, based on a holistic liberal arts education, produces effective leaders capable of independent, critical, and creative thinking.

Internationally recognized professors will teach diverse approaches to each discipline in small seminar-style classes. These classes will form the knowledge base from which students can research and prepare for their (optional) senior year thesis.
